Subject Pronouns Lesson Plan

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Level of students: Junior Primary Topic: My family No. of lessons: 1 Duration: 40 minutes

Learning objectives:

By the end of the lessons, students will be able to:

- 1. Tell the different subject pronouns in English;
- 2. Replace repeated nouns with subject pronouns;
- 3. Tell the similarities of English and Chinese subject pronouns.

Time	Procedure	Teaching aids
5 min	 Activity One: Context building "My family" 1. Ask students about their family, e.g. How many family members are there in your family? 2. Show a picture of the Simpson family to the students. Ask them to tell the names of the family members. 3. Play a song about the Simpson family. 4. Show students a passage about the family. 5. Read aloud the passage with the students (stress the subjects). 6. Ask students to tell what is wrong with the passage (repeated noun phrases as subjects). 15 min	 Activity Two: "Chinese VS English" 7. Show students the passage again. 8. Ask students to replace the subject nouns with subject pronouns, and read the passage. 9. Ask students which version is better. 10. Ask students to tell the Chinese meanings of the subject pronouns. 	PPT Worksheet (Ex 1)

	 Tell students that subject pronouns can avoid repetitive use of subject nouns. Tell students that Maggie is talking to Jenny about her grandparents. Ask students to complete Exercise 1 with correct pronouns. 	
20 min	 Activity Three: Game "In and out" 14. Tell students how to play the game: All students have to stand up. Each student takes turns to pick a card from a tin and reads aloud the sentence on the card. If a pronoun is wrongly used in the sentence, then the student who gets the card has to sit down, which means he/she is out of the game. Other students have to tell what is wrong about the sentence. The game continues until all cards are picked. 	Word cards A tin
Homework	Ask students to complete Exercise 2 as homework.	Worksheet (Ex 2)
